A Snow Mobile for George

[THREE NIGHTS ONLY, DIRECTOR APPEARANCE] One of the leading causes of death on snowmobiles is decapitation. And when you pit a pack of snowmobiles against a herd of bison, the snowmobiles win. Snowmobiles are hardcore. You can see proof in Todd Darling's documentary *A Snow Mobile for George*, as Darling tows his snowmobile, "Sindy," around the country looking for answers to questions about environmental degradation caused by governmental deregulation. (The titular "George" is our beloved Dubya.) Darling talks to farmers and Native American tribes along Oregon's Klamath River (which has been devastated by drought caused by the government's water diversions), ranchers in Wyoming who are having their private land tattooed with the government's oil drills and natural gas pumps, and lobbyists for the pro- and anti-snowmobile lobbies in Washington, D.C. Darling's interviews with these people give honest and gritty insights into the life-changing impacts deregulation policies have had on those who depend on the environment for their well-being.
